Why Virtual Drive?

- Virtual Drive was implemented in order to offer a high added value service to clients.

Achieved Results

- The clients define their own types of documents, metadata and filters.



The Business

Xerox is an American global corporation with revenues of US\$10.77 billion and 37,200 employees worldwide, selling document solutions and services, and document technology products in more than 160 countries, headquartered in Norwalk, CT. As a large developed company, it is consistently placed in the list of Fortune 500 companies since its founding on April 18, 1906 over a century ago.

The Problem

Xerox in Argentina and Chile had a large volume of OCR documents and paper documents and archived microfilm for many clients including insurance companies that were nearly impossible to search across and find relevant information. This led to inaccurate and incomplete data evaluation.

They need to integrate all their documents into one contained data silo for search and discover information from numerous disparate data formats.

The Solution

While several other companies could solve part of Xerox's problem, Mototech Group's Big Data solution, was able to handle all pieces including the most difficult component, the microfilm. This rehydrated archived data that went back decades providing a 100% view across all the documents for applying predictive analytics and business decisions based on the entirety of the data.

Benefits

Mototech's solution dramatically increased data accuracy across the entire Argentinian and Chilean operations while improving business decisions and revenues. Old data that was previously unused, came back into production. Time savings also increased as the manual searching of microfilm was eliminated.
